PHARMACEUTICAL SOCIETY OF IRELAND RULES REGARDING THE RECEIVING AND RECORDING OF EVIDENCE BY A COMMITTEE OF INQUIRY

The Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Ireland, in exercise of the functions conferred on the said Society by section 11 and section 43(4)(c) of the Pharmacy Act 2007, hereby makes the following rules:-

- 1. These Rules may be cited as the Pharmaceutical Society of Ireland Rules Regarding the Receiving and Recording of Evidence by a Committee of Inquiry 201[•].
- 2. These Rules shall come into force on [•].
- 3. Pursuant to the provisions of section 11 and section 43(4)(c) of the Pharmacy Act, 2007, a Committee of Inquiry may receive evidence of witnesses given by means of live-video link or any other mode of transmission.
- 4. The registered pharmacist or registered retail pharmacy business and / or the registrar is entitled to make submissions as to the appropriateness of receiving evidence by means of live-video link or any other mode of transmission. The Committee of Inquiry shall make a ruling on each submission.
- 5. Any expenses incurred in respect of live-video link evidence of witnesses called by or on behalf of the registered pharmacist or registered retail pharmacy business, the subject of the inquiry, shall be the responsibility of the registered pharmacist or registered retail pharmacy business.
