

PSI Inspection Policy Project Report on Focus Group Meetings: Self-Audit for Pharmacies

August 2015

1. Background: Focus Group Meetings

To assist the PSI and the Project Team in the design and development of a self-audit tool for pharmacies, pharmacists and pharmacy owners were invited to participate in focus group meetings.

On 23rd June 2015, a call for expressions of interest was sent by email for participants in these focus group meetings on the development and design of a self-audit tool for pharmacies.

Expressions of interest were received, and on the basis of the locations of the respondents, 5 locations were selected for the focus group meetings. The dates / locations for all meetings were circulated to all registered pharmacists and pharmacy owners, and registration for these meetings invited.

Participants in the focus group meetings had the opportunity to input into the design and development of the self-audit tool for pharmacies, by providing opinions on the self-audit and providing feedback of their experience of self-audits within their practice, while the Project Team had the opportunity to engage with pharmacists.

2. Focus Group Meetings

Five focus group meetings were conducted over a 10 day period, at five locations around the country:

3. Participants

A total of 49 participants attended the five focus group meetings around the country.

All participants were pharmacists, and the group included superintendent pharmacists, supervising pharmacists and pharmacy owners.

■ Total: 49 (0.9% of all registered pharmacists¹)

Superintendent Pharmacists: 22 (45%)
 Supervising Pharmacists: 25 (51%)
 Pharmacy Owners: 16 (33%)

Pharmacists 0 – 10 years registered: 20 (41%)
 Pharmacists more than 10 years registered: 29 (59%)

4. Focus Group Meeting Format

Each focus group meeting lasted approx. 1.5 - 2 hours and consisted of the following:

- Introduction
- Background Presentation on Inspection Policy Project [Slides available at Appendix
 1]
- Discussion
- Close

The discussion section focussed on the following areas:

- I. Experience of using self-audit / self-assessment tools
- II. Benefits of using self-audit tools
- III. Limitations of using self-audit tools
- IV. Motivations / encouragements for using self-audit tools
- V. Supports to help in completing self-audit tools
- VI. Areas for inclusion in self-audit tools

5. Discussion Topics

During the discussion section of the meeting, participants were encouraged to discuss their experiences and thoughts on the use of a self-audit tool within their pharmacy practice.

A record of each discussion was taken by the focus group facilitators to capture the views expressed during the discussion. The following table presents a summary of most frequent categories under which participants made comments:

High Level Discussion Points

Self-Audit should be easy to use / not time consuming

The focus of the self-audit should be on areas effecting patient safety

Emphasis within self-audit should be on:

- (i) improvements made
- (ii) measures to minimise risk
- (iii) self-improvement

It would be helpful to have guidance and/or additional information on the self-audit

Self-audit should be practical and relevant to practice within the pharmacy

Within self-audit, highlight the areas of most importance e.g. traffic light system

Importance and value of peer reviews when completing self-audit

To promote honesty in completing self-audit, pharmacists need to know that there's no consequences to filling out self-audit

Self-audit is useful to prepare for PSI inspections

Suggested use of another format other than 'tick box' format

Self-audit is useful as a management tool for supervising pharmacist / superintendent pharmacist / pharmacy owner

Suggest use of an on-line self-audit

Self-Audit should include a scoring / grading system

PSI needs to provide clarity on standards expected

Please note that this is <u>not</u> a record of all points raised during the discussion.

6. Feedback


Feedback forms were provided to all participants at the end of each focus group meeting. Three questions were asked:

- i. Do you consider that the format of the focus group meeting was successful and provided an opportunity for interaction?
 - **47/47** respondents (100%) made a positive response

- ii. Do you have any additional comments or feedback on the development of the Self-Audit Tool for pharmacies?
 - 36 additional comments or feedback were received
- iii. Are you interested in being involved in other elements of the project as discussed this evening?
 - 41 respondents expressed an interest in being involved in other elements of the project

Self-Audit for Pharmacies

- What do we mean by Self-Audit?
 - Document to review practises at the pharmacy and manage risks
- Purpose
 - · Review and assess current practices
 - · Identify potential risks and areas for improvement
 - Action plan to address any deficiencies identified
 - · Continuous record of improvements made

Self-Audit for Pharmacies

- How will this benefit pharmacies?
 - Improvements in pharmacy standards and patient safety
 - Allows pharmacies to demonstrate compliance and the good practices in place at the pharmacy
 - Supports Supervising Pharmacists and Superintendent Pharmacists in demonstrating their control and oversight of the pharmacy practise
 - · Preparation for inspection
 - Document showing on-going improvements
