



IN THE MATTER OF PART 6 OF THE PHARMACY ACT 2007

Mr Chandrakant Vyas MPSI (Reg. No. 5224)

Following the submission of a report of the Professional Conduct Committee (the “**Committee**”), the Council, at its meeting on 19 September 2019, decided to censure Mr Vyas MPSI in relation to the findings of professional misconduct made by the Committee in its report, dated 2 April 2019, which are set out in Appendix 1 attached to this notice.

APPENDIX ONE

That you, while you were a Registered Pharmacist and Superintendent Pharmacist at Pharmacy A (hereinafter referred to as the “**Pharmacy**”) and whereas:

- On or about the 29 May 2015, one or more units of medicinal products as outlined at Appendix A, which were not at that date authorised for sale and/or supply on the Irish market by way of a valid marketing authorisation, were made available and/or caused to be made available and/or permitted to be made available for sale and/or supply; and/or
- On or about 13 July 2015, one or more units of medicinal products as outlined at Appendix B, which were not at that date authorised for sale and/or supply on the Irish market by way of a valid marketing authorisation, were made available and/or caused to be made available and/or permitted to be made available for sale and/or supply:

In your capacity as Superintendent Pharmacist, you failed:

- (a) to ensure that medicinal products made available for sale and/or supply in the Pharmacy were authorised by way of a valid marketing authorisation for sale and/or supply on the Irish Market; and/or

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- (b) to ensure that there were adequate controls and/or procedures in place at the Pharmacy so as to prevent unauthorised medicinal products from being made available for sale and/or supply in the Pharmacy.

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
